Comment: After reading the amended documents my objection to the proposed development still stands due to its significant adverse effects on the local wildlife and the potential consequences for the well-being of our friends and family! The disruption caused by the construction and presence of the development will undoubtedly disturb and disrupt the natural habitat of the wildlife in the area. The anticipated light pollution from the development will have a direct impact on the surrounding environment, potentially disrupting the natural rhythms of nocturnal creatures and affecting the overall ecosystem. The concerns of potential flooding pose a serious risk to both the proposed development and the neighbouring properties.
